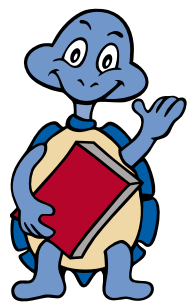

Her refusal to vacate the seat on the bus for whites is considered as the beginning of the black civil rights movement

Performances

- **1. Dezember 1955:** Rosa Parks refused to vacate the seat for a white passenger, and was subsequently arrested. After that Martin Luther King organized the Montgomery Bus Boycott, which later led to the abolition of racial segregation in buses / trains, and is considered as the trigger of many other protests of the civil rights movement in America.
- She was active in the Black Power movement and the support of political prisoners in the US.
- **1965 to 1988:** secretary and receptionist to John Conyers, an African-American US Representative.
- National recognitions: incl. the NAACP's Spingarn Medal, the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the Congressional Gold Medal. She was the first woman to lie in honor in the Capitol Rotunda
- **1 Dec/4 Feb „Tribute to Rosa Parks Day“:** the bus seat behind the driver should remain free
